<p><i>Mental Images</i></p>		<p>Good readers must be able to make pictures or movies in their head of things they see.</p> <p><i>“When I was reading, I saw...”</i></p>
<p><i>Making Connections</i></p>		<p>Good readers must make connections with text.</p> <p><i>Nuts and bolts connection objects together.</i></p>
<p><i>Asking Questions</i></p>		<p>Good readers must ask questions when they are reading.</p> <p><i>Which type of screwdriver will get the job done right?</i></p>
<p><i>Making Inferences</i></p>		<p>Good readers must “read between the lines”.</p> <p><i>You must make accurate measurements to get the job done right.</i></p>
