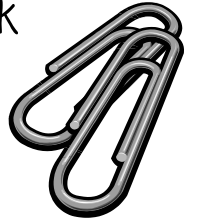


# The Reading Web

Your child will get a paper clip for each book he/she has read, one for each book someone else reads to him/her, and one for shared, paired, choral, and echo reading.



- **SHARED READING** is when children join in reading repetitive sentences, predictable language, or special phrases.
- **PAIRED READING** is when the adult and child take turns reading the same text three times and asking questions about the text.
- **CHORAL READING** is when parent and child both read out loud together.
- **ECHO READING** is when the parent reads a short selection of text and the child imitates the parent's fluent reading.

Paper clips will be strung together to make a "Reading web" in our classroom. A running total will be calculated at the end of each week. You and your child can select methods of reading each book. The title of the book and how it was read is recorded on the **Reading at Home** sheet. Your child should bring their form in only when it is completed and pick up another form when it is needed. Make reading at home an enjoyable experience for you and your child! Please let me know if you have any questions.

Dear Parents,

Below is a sample of the Reading at Home form that your child will bring home to record books read. I have put checks in the boxes to show you what a form **may look like** when completed.

**PLEASE:** List the name of the book. Put a tally mark in the boxes to indicate how the book was read. You can read all 6 ways with the same book if you like.

\*In the early stages, some children have difficulty reading books. You may want to read to your child and help them get points. I encourage your reading to your child even as they become a reader. This is very important!
